Objective

Contracted dental treatment is carried out as an 'in hospital' elective service in a district health board (DHB) hospital, usually when a client has serious injuries to their mouth. Contracted treatment is classified as either core or non-core treatment.

Policy

1.0 Rules

a Treatment must be carried out by a dental specialist who holds a medical or dental council registration as an oral and maxillo-facial surgeon.

2.0 Core treatment

a Elective dental treatment is covered by six core treatment contracts that are processed by Treatment and Support. See Elective Services and Oral-maxillofacial treatment procedures list.

The agreed treatment price is a total price. There should be no extra payment from the client for ACC-approved treatment.

4.0 Non-core treatment

a Non-core treatment is carried out by a contracted provider but is not considered to be the same as, or similar to, a listed core procedure. For example, the procedure may not be in the contract list, or it may be a procedure that is a combination of contracted procedures.

The Elective Surgery teams at the service centres can negotiate these prices.
