#### **Summary**

#### Objective

If the best way of restoring a client's independence is by providing a vehicle solution, we can contribute to the costs of driving lessons for a client.

Driver training can be used:

- if the best way of restoring the client's independence is helping them to drive their own private vehicle
- if the client has had a driver licence before but is no longer licensed to drive for any accident-related reason
- to provide training to the client to drive a modified vehicle independently and safely
- to build a client's confidence in operating a modified vehicle that we consider suitable for restoring their independence
- to help a client prepare for a driver licence test or renewal so they can legally drive their modified vehicle (although we do not contribute to the actual license test costs as getting a current driver license is a process common to all citizens)
- to provide specialised driver training, such as learning to use hand controls in a modified vehicle.

### **Procedure**

#### 1.0 Relevant legislation

a We need to make sure clients are legally permitted to drive before modifying or buying a vehicle and can drive safely. See Accident Compensation Act 2001, Schedule 1, clause 21 (4).

# 2.0 Identifying whether a client needs driving training

a The transport assessor will determine whether the client is likely to need extra instruction or training to safely use the specialist equipment and controls installed in a modified vehicle.

If the assessor is concerned about a client's ability to drive safely they may complete an on-road driving assessment, often with the assistance of a driving instructor.

The assessor typically identifies driver training needs either:

- · during the initial assessment
- in the case of a highly-modified vehicle, at the visit to the vehicle modifier at the end of Stage 1 modifications.

#### 3.0 Delivery of the driver training

- a The assessor will:
  - arrange for a driving instructor
  - ensure the lessons is provided within the agreed timeframe
  - invoice ACC for the driving instructor's services within the Transport for Independence Assessments Service.

The driving instructor invoices the assessor, not ACC.
