

**ERRATUM TO THE
SERVICE AND PURCHASE AGREEMENT 2012-15
BETWEEN THE MINISTER FOR ACC AND THE ACCIDENT
COMPENSATION CORPORATION**

Background

The Service and Purchase Agreement 2012-15 between the Minister for ACC and the Accident Compensation Corporation required by section 271 of the Accident Compensation Act 2001 ("SPA") was signed by the Minister for ACC and the Accident Compensation Corporation (the Corporation) and tabled in Parliament on 28 June 2012.


An error has been found in the table on page 24 of the SPA where numbers have been transposed.


Erratum in relation to SPA
