Paying for your services

You can either work under **Cost of Treatment Regulations** or a contract. What we pay under regulations is set out in legislation, whereas the rate for contracted providers depends on the contract held. You can also use Telehealth where clinically appropriate.

Lodging a claim

If you're lodging a claim for an injury or diagnosis, you'll need a Read Code to match it. These help us tailor support and care for your patient based on their needs. You can find a list of common codes on our website.

Issuing medical certificates

If your patient needs to reduce their work hours or adjust their work duties because of an injury, a GP or nurse practitioner can issue a medical certificate. Remaining connected to the workplace is good for an injured person's physical and mental health.

More about paying for your services

If you're a general practitioner, nurse, or a nurse practitioner, we can contribute to two parts of your treatment services:

1. A consultation rate

We pay a higher rate for clients under 14 years, and community services cardholders and their dependents (14 to 17 years) to compensate you for providing them with free or lower cost visits.

2. Specific treatments or procedures a patient might get during a visit.

We'll only contribute to the cost of the treatment or procedures set out in the Regulations.
