Paying for your services

As a speech language therapist, you'll be working under Cost of Treatment Regulations. That means what we pay for your services is set out in legislation. The latest rates are on our website. You can also use Telehealth where clinically appropriate.

Check what's covered

Before you start providing your services, make sure you know what injury your client is covered for by checking:

- the patient's referral letter
- the patient's ACC45 form
- contact us by phone or through the website.

Extending treatment

If your patient needs 16 or more treatments or it's been more than a year since an allied health provider first treated them, you'll need prior approval from us. Find out how to submit a request.
